

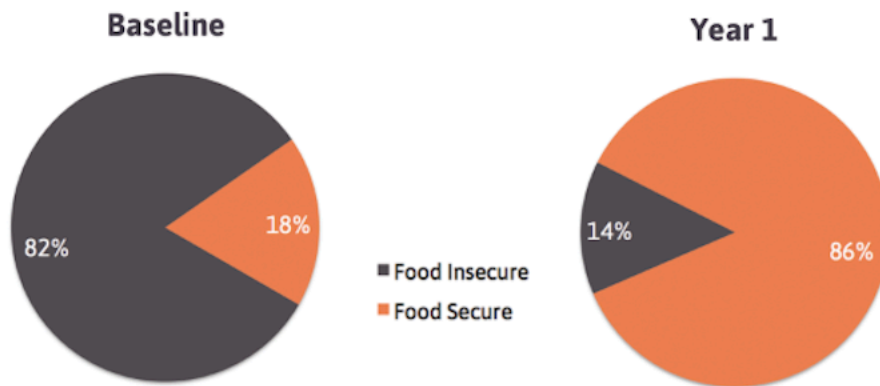

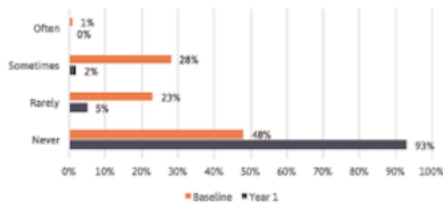
OUR IMPACT

We are currently working with 1,654 families, comprised of 12,069 people, across our four projects in Senegal. TREES technicians conduct a survey to measure the food security and economic resilience of participating families. This survey is comprised of 86 questions (many of which are used by USAID and the UN) and conducted at the beginning of the project to establish a baseline and again every year afterwards at the same time each year. This allows TREES to better understand the impact its program has on the lives of participants in the Forest Garden Program, and the results have been incredible. Our latest data from Senegal indicates that just after the first year of the four-year project, we are already ending food insecurity for most of the participating families, and we aim to end hunger among the remaining 14% over the next year.

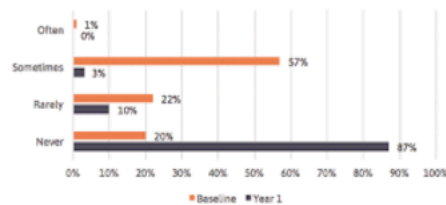
OUR RESULTS AFTER 1 YEAR



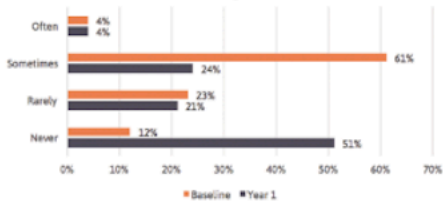
"In the past 4 weeks, did you or any household member go a whole day and night without eating anything because there was not enough food?"
